Ready, Set, Live!

Kelvyn Park Senior Satellite Center (KPSC) is proud to announce the launch of an enhanced and expanded version of Common Ground, now renamed Ready, Set, Live!, a program designed to cultivate intergenerational engagement. Spring sessions will begin on March 7 for older adults aged 55 and above.

"When COVID-19 hit, we had to inject a lot of digital literacy into our lives, leading to a huge gap between older adults and their computer knowledge," Linda Peters, Director of Older Adult Programs, said. "Many older adults were left behind, with many social services moving to digital space. They also had to navigate getting tested and vaccines, as you had to sign up for them all digitally."

In 2023, the original funder for Common Ground, the Retirement Research Foundation (RRF), concluded its financial support, prompting Peters to seek alternative sponsors. During this period, Peters discussed with Capital One, a longstanding supporter of Northwest Center's Older Adult initiatives. Capital One's commitment to empowering older adults made them an ideal partner for Common Ground. Their generous funding has enabled KPSC to expand the program into a comprehensive 12-week curriculum encompassing various essential components.

Ready, Set, Live! will now include Capital One's online banking program, Ready, Set, Bank!, curriculum, which addresses mental wellness, nutritional wellness, intergenerational and racial engagement, cultural sharing, and digital literacy. Recognizing the importance of financial literacy, the program will also collaborate with PNC Bank and Northwest Center Financial Coaches to educate participants on online banking and fraud prevention.

"The primary objective of this restructuring is to offer a more comprehensive and holistic program. We aim to enhance the lives of older adults by addressing multiple facets, including social, health, financial, and overall well-being. Through this initiative, we empower older adults to have a voice for positive change within their community," emphasizes Peters.

If you have an older adult in your life and aspire to improve their quality of life, this is an ideal program for them. Brian Moro, Health Data and Operations Manager, joined Northwest Center in early 2020, becoming a valuable addition to the Health Equity Team during the organization's intensive COVID-19 efforts.

With deep roots in the Northwest Area of Chicago and a lifelong connection to the community, Moro's presence was a natural fit. "Growing up in this area and attending school here, I was deeply involved in the community. A friend who had joined Northwest Center referred me to the Health Equity Team," Moro said.

Throughout the pandemic, the Health Equity Team made significant strides in community outreach, actively engaging with residents to educate them about the impact of COVID-19 and encouraging their participation in mobile vaccination clinics.

"I consider myself fortunate to have been part of this movement," Moro said. "Through our collective efforts, we transformed Belmont Cragin from the most severely affected neighborhood in the state, with residents facing the highest risk of mortality from COVID-19, to becoming the most vaccinated neighborhood in the city."

Following his time with the Health Equity Team, Moro temporarily left the organization to pursue further education and experience in data entry and evaluation. However, fate intervened, leading him back to Northwest Center. "It all came full circle. Northwest Center truly embodies its values, which align closely with my own. They provide exceptional opportunities for leadership development. Last year, I had the privilege of speaking on a national conference panel, thanks to NWC's support," Moro said.

Since his return, Moro has worked to develop data-driven strategies that contribute to the community's ongoing efforts to stay informed. "My goal is to effectively communicate our achievements and paint a comprehensive picture of our community through quantitative and qualitative data. This information is crucial for the community and securing grants to sustain these vital programs," Moro said. "As regional leads for the Northwest Side of Chicago, the Health Equity Team holds responsibility for building a strong network and promoting the overall well-being of our neighborhood."
